Dear researchers

Welcome to our Spring 2022 updates for [Intake24.org](#) at Cambridge.

Intake24 new and updated resources:

We will be launching new Intake24 webpages soon, where we will host resources to help you make the most of using Intake24. However, in the meantime we wanted to share the following resources with you:

- **Data dictionary:** in this updated version we have expanded the descriptions and added in a further tab which includes NDNS sub-food groupings
- **Intake24.org at Cambridge general information document:** this has been updated to cover more information on data management and tool development
- **Updated Intake24 Study Setup form:** we have updated this to improve our study setup process

Cambridge updates:

- **Intake24 Evaluation:** Intake24 was introduced into the [UK National Diet and Nutrition Survey \(NDNS\)](#) in October 2019. The method change is being evaluated, the report of the first stage has now been published: [Evaluation of Intake24 in the UK National Diet and Nutrition Survey](#). The second stage evaluation report (including a doubly labelled water assessment) is planned for publication towards the end of 2022.

Intake24 community news:

- **Intake24 Version 4 Development:** Cambridge along with the technical founder, [Open Lab](#), Newcastle University, and also supported by [Monash University](#), Australia, are leading work to upgrade the code base of Intake24. Amongst other improvements, this will allow greater flexibility to customise the tool for specific research requirements. Work is progressing well and we expect the new version will be available later in 2022.

- **Intake24 internationalisation:** The Intake24 community is growing! Intake24 is being developed for the next Australia Health Survey (led by [Australian Bureau of Statistics](#) and [Food Standards Australia New Zealand](#), working in conjunction with [Monash University](#) and [Open Lab](#), Newcastle University for technical input). New Zealand have also recently confirmed they will be developing Intake24 for use in their next nutrition survey.
